
FAC&U 2019 Annual Meeting Recap

The Villas of Grand Cypress Resort hosted this year's FAC&U annual meeting on June 5, 2019 at its Executive Meeting Center. This one-day event welcomed over 30 respected leaders in higher education from across the state representing the State University System, the Florida College System, and the Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida. It was a wonderful event that engaged presidents, vice presidents, and provosts to share new ideas and voice concerns across issues that will affect higher ed in the immediate or near future.

Attendees heard from several thought leaders on a wide range of topics. New York Times Best-Selling Author and former Senior Advisor at the State Department, Alec Ross, shared a vision for the changes in industry, data, and technology that will significantly impact workforce development over the next ten years. Scott Jaschik, CEO and publisher of Inside Higher Ed, tackled current trends and hot button issues occurring on many campuses in Florida and across



the nation. Next, Dr. Sam Staley, Director of the FSU Devoe L. Moore Center, led an interactive dialogue with college and university leaders on the state of free speech and debate on campus. President John Holdnak from Gulf Coast State College in Panama City, Florida, talked about the lessons learned from Hurricane Michael and showed images of the devastation in

Participants shared their thoughts, concerns, and key learnings from various recent events making local and national headlines. Locally, Dr. Meadows serves on the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (Co-Lab) Policy Board and serves as an Ex-Officio member on the FloridaWest Economic Development Alliance, and ex-officio of the Board of First Place Partners.



Vice President - Larry Thompson - Ringling College of Art and Design

Dr. Larry R. Thompson, president of Ringling College of Art and Design since July 1999, champions the need for businesses to embrace creativity to thrive in the 21st century global economy. A lawyer and an educator, Thompson previously served as Special Assistant to the President of Ohio State University; CEO of Flint Cultural Center; and founding Executive Director and CEO of Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum. Thompson is former President of the Association of Independent Colleges of Art and Design (AICAD) and currently serves on its Executive Committee.
